# 2020 Strategy and Tactics SEMINARS

Presented by Speed & Smarts

In 2020 we are offering 7 seminars focused on racing strategy and tactics:  
1) **Starting** 2) **Upwind** 3) **Downwind** 4) **Mark Rounding** 5) **Boatspeed**  
6) **Racing Rules** and 7) **Drone's-Eye View**.

**What the sailors get:** Lots of practical race-winning tips to improve their strategic and tactical repertoire. A printed workbook (or newsletter) that covers the content of each seminar. A free one-year subscription to Speed & Smarts! A free pen. Special discounts on all educational stuff from Speed & Smarts.

**Speed & Smarts provides:** The course curriculum and instructor (we'll work with each club to organize a date, topics and instructor). The sailor materials described above. A projector, magnetic boats, markers and so on. Promotion of seminars to our in-house lists.

**The host club provides:** The seminar venue including a darkened room, chairs at tables, large magnetic white board, projection screen. Promotion and registration. Email addresses of all participants (after the seminar) so we can set up Speed & Smarts subscriptions and send an evaluation form. Optional food and drink.

**Seminar price per sailor:** The host club chooses how much \$ to charge sailors for admission to the seminars. Some clubs cover all the costs themselves (*see next page*) and allow sailors to attend for free. Other clubs charge sailors for part or all of their cost to host the seminars. We think an admission price of \$25 to \$40 for one three-hour seminar or \$50 to \$75 for two seminars (all day) would be very reasonable compared to what sailors pay for similar seminars.

**Hosting a seminar:** If you are interested in holding a Speed & Smarts seminar in 2020, pick two seminar topics (*or you can wait to choose these*), and email us with some date preferences (*this is important - see possible dates on next page*). We will then get back to you and start talking about a date, topic and instructor that will work for you and for Speed & Smarts. Once we settle on details, we will ask you to sign a letter of agreement. For seminars on popular dates we might ask for a deposit.

**Seminar Fees** Our intention is to set the seminar fees so that:

- 1) Sailors can attend the seminars for a reasonable price;
- 2) The host club will not lose money and has a chance to raise money; and
- 3) *Speed & Smarts* is fairly compensated for the instructor's time and travel expenses, plus the general cost of running the seminars (including the printed handouts).

We think the fairest arrangement is a sliding scale based on the number of attendees. We hope for a large crowd at every seminar, but we realize that won't always happen, and we don't think a host club should have to pay the same fee when they have 20 sailors as when they have 50. The host club keeps any surplus of income over costs.


Here are the fees for a full day (from 9 to 4) that includes two of these *Speed & Smarts* seminars: Starting, Upwind, Downwind, Mark Rounding, Boatspeed and Racing Rules.

> 55 attendees	\$1750


*Sailors 18 or younger count 1/2.*

The **Drone's-Eye View** seminar is designed to fit a typical evening time slot of about 2 hours. The fee for this seminar is \$900, or \$1250 if travel requires the instructor to stay overnight (and no other S&S seminars are scheduled). Travel expenses are extra.

This seminar has a lot of videos, so it requires a room that is relatively dark. A large, high-definition TV can also be helpful (but is not required).
